What's going on at UCP?

Jim Weber is the Director of Business Operations and over sees the Clinic and Home based Therapy along with the Revenue Cycle process at UCP. Here are some of the changes Jim has implemented so far for the enhancement of those particular programs.

- ⇒ There has been some restructure in Management where Janet Proch is now Clinic
 Therapy Manager and Amy White is now the dedicated Home Therapy Manager, and is also over the Early Intervention Program
- ⇒ Expansion continues to be the goal. For referrals please contact Janet Proch for Clinic therapy and Amy White for Home therapy.
- ⇒ The Clinic Family Room is now located within the Therapy area which allows the family to be closer to the entire therapy process.
- ⇒ The process of implementation of the new Electronic Medical Record System, WebPT is here as of Feb. 2nd! It is a web based operational system that is designed specifically for Medical Therapists. This system has replaced the Accumedic system for the Therapy area, both Clinic and Home based.
- ⇒ The implementation of a new Billing and Collections systems for Therapy called Kareo is forthcoming. This is a state of the art system that will improve overall collections.

- ⇒ UCP received a \$25,000 grant from the Tohono O'Odham Nation! What this means is we now have scholarships available for the ELC. Contact The ELC Director for more information.
- ⇒ Also, there is slots available in the infant and 1 year old classrooms.
- ⇒ DTT is thrilled to have received a holiday gift from the Allen School. A NEW STOVE!
- ⇒ Congratulations to Kevin Lyons who was promoted to Program Supervisor and we wish Sondra Reed all the best in her new Program Lead position along with Brandy Boulrice who was promoted to Program Lead (18-21) classroom.


